Generosity abounds! This congregation has always been a giving congregation. The evidence is all around. Allow me to point to some of it.

As of this writing, I'm actually overwhelmed by a huge pile of new and used baby clothes and toys, along with large packs of diapers and wipes that we've collected during our Epiphany "Baby

Shower for Jesus." I will load up my truck and take those down to the Gabriel Project for their distribution. Those items will go a long way to meet the needs of young babies and their families.

I am overwhelmed by the pile of bags filled to the brim with clothing, shoes, belts and the like for women. The local YWCA houses women who are fleeing domestic violence, unemployment, mental health, and other issues that lead to their being unhoused. The YWCA also has a thrift store that provides clothing free of charge, yet presented in a way that allows women to "shop" with dignity. These items piled up in our Narthex will clothe God's precious children when they need it most.

We had a pile of food stacked up in the office from our Sunday Gleaning collection. I'm so grateful that our secretary, Jennifer, delivered those to Catholic Charities for us last week. As you read this, because of our generosity someone's belly is being filled and their table has more joy.

We have a very generous Outreach Giving Policy. After a year of your financial gifts to the congregation, we have finished our accounting and have just issued the checks for signatures. There are 20 checks representing around \$42,000 worth of gifts that support agencies in our valley meeting the needs of God's children, as well as denominational efforts meeting the spiritual needs of God's children throughout WV and around the globe. Add to that, around \$3,200 in benevolence funds spent on helping individuals within the church and its circle of influence. We also collected and shared

HELPING OUTSIDE OUR CHURCH WALLS

Local organizations are addressing the many needs of our community.

The Winter Freeze Shelter in Wheeling, homelessness, food insecurity, substance abuse programs, rent assistance, mortgage assistance, utility assistance, and kinship programs headline the agendas of many community service meetings.

This month's newsletter is going to focus on one of those programs: The Winter Freeze Shelter. Joyce Wolen is part of the team that is working on the Shelter.





WHEELING WINTER FREEZE SHELTER

The ballroom of Catholic Charities was converted to the Winter Freeze Shelter when last year's site (the former Hillcrest at the former Ohio Valley Medical Center) was unavailable for winter 2022-2023. The Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston is providing the space at Catholic Charities on Main Street in Wheeling and has donated to the shelter operations.

The low-barrier shelter will run through mid-March or longer depending on weather. The shelter will be open from 8:00 pm to 8:00 am.

Donations are needed. Monetary donations can be sent to Life Hub, PO Box 2089, Wheeling WV 26003. Make checks payable to Life Hub. Questions? Contact Joyce at 304 639-8429 or joyce@wheelingwv-pha.org.

Donations can also be dropped off at 11 Community Street (Elm Grove), Wheeling on Tuesday and Thursday from 8:00 am - 12 noon and 1:00 pm - 3:30 pm. The shelter needs blankets, twin bed sheets (fitted/flat), pillow cases, handwarmers, boots, boxer briefs (all sizes), gloves, hats, scarves, coats, sweatpants, sweatshirts.

The Winter Freeze Shelter does not provide meals and many of the shelter guests eat and get food from the <u>Soup Kitchen of Wheeling</u> (304 233-2992) and <u>Catholic Charities Neighborhood Center</u> (304 232-7157). Please contact either agency to see how you can help.

With economic issues facing us all, coupled with the rising costs associated with ministry, I'm afraid the coming year will be a challenge to remain this generous. For now, I encourage us to tarry awhile in the joy of what we've been able to share this year.

William Booth is quoted as saying, "You cannot warm the hearts of people with God's love if they have an empty stomach and cold feet." Somewhere I picked up the saying, "It's hard to hear the gospel over the sound of a rumbling empty stomach." I don't know if the line is that clear between meeting someone's physical needs vs. meeting someone's spiritual needs. Just as a person is both; just as we worship God with our minds, bodies, souls and strength, we choose to live like Jesus who met the needs of people's minds, bodies, souls and strength. A ministry of wholeness is ministry to the whole person in all of life's varied circumstances.

Now Deborah, a prophet, the wife of Lappidoth, was leading Israel at that time. A judge, at that time, was a tribal leader and advisor in troubled times, one who had authority to settle disputes and problems, and in times of war acted as a rallying point to organize tribes and resistance.

Jael was a tent-dweller whose family were tinsmiths. They traveled to find work, and were close to the battlefield when the Israelites and Canaanites fought. Jael killed Sisera, the mighty general and military commander of the Canaanites.




