Veteran's Day 2021

To all of our veterans, military personnel, and those who support them – thank you! An Act (52 Stat. 351; 5 U. S. Code, Sec. 87a) approved May 13, 1938, made the 11th of November in each year a legal holiday—a day to be dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be thereafter celebrated and known as "Armistice Day." Armistice Day was primarily a day set aside to honor veterans of World War I, but in 1954, after World War II had required the greatest mobilization of soldiers, sailors, Marines and airmen in the Nation's history; after American forces had fought aggression in Korea, the 83rd Congress, at the urging of the veterans service organizations, amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word "Armistice" and inserting in its place the word "Veterans." With the approval of this legislation (Public Law 380) on June 1, 1954, November 11th became a day to honor American veterans of all wars. [Source: https://www.va.gov]

Safety Signal

A 16-year-old girl, who had been missing from her home in North Carolina for days, used the gesture developed by women's groups as a way to surreptitiously signal for aid in domestic violence situations, according to officials.

Anyone can be a victim of domestic violence, and we see articles about kidnapped and at-risk youth all too frequently. Be aware of the hand signal demonstrated below in case you or someone you know needs help, or if you see someone else's sign that they need help.

The signal involves holding up a hand, palm out, in a "stop" gesture, then closing the hand with the thumb inside.

During this time, beneficiaries have the option of changing their Part D Prescription product for 2022 as well as making other Medicare and/or Medicare Advantage changes. Beneficiaries should have received their current product's Annual Notice of Changes so they can begin to prepare for the upcoming AEP.
